A United States federal program of social insurance and benefits developed in 1935. The Social Security program's benefits include retirement income, disability income, Medicare and Medicaid, and death and survivorship benefits. Social Security is one of the largest government programs in the world, paying out hundreds of billions of dollars per year.

Medicare helps out people at a time in their lives when they may have serious health problems but lack the funding for treatment. Medicare is a U.S. federal health program that subsidizes people who meet one of the following criteria:

- An individual aged 65 or older who has been a U.S. citizen or permanent legal resident for five years.
- An individual who is disabled and has collected Social Security for a minimum of two years.
- An individual who is undergoing dialysis for kidney failure or who is in need of a kidney transplant.
- An individual who has Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (Lou Gehrig's disease).
